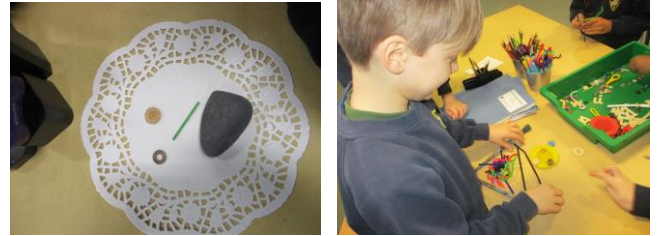
Water

School Shoes

School Uniform

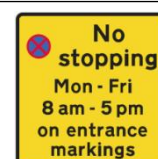
