

Below is a step by step on how to create a piece of melted crayon art using a hair dryer. Have a go!



You will need an adult's help if using a hairdryer. Melted crayon will be VERY HOT so DO NOT TOUCH it until it has cooled and is no longer dripping.



You could do art by melting something else- what about a melted chocolate piece of art, or melted ice cream!

It will probably be a messy job but get creative and see what you come up with.
